In 1965 Sonia Pressman Fuentes joined the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission three months after it was formed, as the first female attorney in the Office of General Counsel. She fought against sex discrimination and was awarded a Superior Performance Award for her hard work. In 1966 she became one of the founding members of the National Organization for Women.

Ms. Fuentes graduated Phi Beta Kappa from Cornell University in 1950 and was first in her class at the University of Miami School of Law in 1957. She graduated from Monticello High School in 1946 and lived in Woodridge from 1936 to 1941. She was an attorney for 36 years with the federal government and multinational corporations and drafted a number of the EEOC's landmark guidelines and decisions. She was also a founder of the Women's Equity Action League (WEAL) and Federally Employed Women (FEW).

In November 1996 she was presented with the Veteran Feminists of America (VFA) Medal of Honor by Betty Friedan, in recognition of her efforts to improve the status of women. She retired from her law career in 1993, but has been very busy as a feminine activist, a volunteer, a writer and a public

speaker.

When I heard about Ms. Fuenand her connection to Woodridge, I contacted her and we have been communicating via e-mail and telephone. I was impressed to find a lovely, interesting and down to earth woman with great stories about Woodridge and Monticello, some of which I will share. I already feel as though I have known her forever.

At the time of Sonia's birth in 1928, Hinda and Zysia Pressman, along with her brother Hermann, lived in Berlin, Germany. Her father owned a men's clothing store and factory. Her mother and brother both worked there. By 1933 the family was doing well financially, Mrs. Pressman was 40, Mr. Pressman, 39, Hermann, 18, and Sonia, 4.

Hermann was the first to realize the impending horror the Nazi

regime was to create for the Jews of Germany. He tried to get his parents to leave with no luck. Hermann moved to Belgium and sevimmediate family joined him. Mr. allowed the family to leave Gerfor a small fraction of what they joined Hermann in Antwerp.
